PIONEER DAYS – MAY 2010

Chris Kauth awaits visitors to the Germantown Historical Society Museum on May 7 as she and other museum members were on hand to portray various people from Germantown's history, such as Elizabeth Dhein, wife of Phillip Dhein who founded the Dheinsville settlement.

Dheinsville was the place to be on May 6th & 7th with enthusiastic assistance from local high school German students and our society members. Student visitors from three schools: St. Boniface, David's Star and Morning Star Lutheran were given an introduction to local Wisconsin history circa 1850's.

Students toured the Bast Bell Museum, discovered the family life at the Wolf Haus and marveled at the Church and it's stained glass windows. The children had an opportunity to visit with Mr. and Mrs. Dhein, a Civil War soldier and sample molasses cookies.

This two day event is held every other year so now is the time to think about joining the team and introducing Wisconsin to the young people of the area.

Thank You....these two words are not nearly enough but a great place to start when talking about Eileen Densow who is a member of our Board of Directors. Eileen has been involved with the Germantown Historical Society since the beginning and continues to help in anyway possible. In April, Eileen stepped down as Secretary a position that she has filled since 1976 when Irene asked her to take over that position, and we thank her for this and many things.

Eileen has been and continues to be a vital part of the historical society. She is currently the curator of the Bell Museum and plans the Bell of the Month program each month. She spent countless hours when the Bell Museum first opened researching and labeling the bells. She assists at many of the tours and can always be counted on pitch in wherever needed. At Oktoberfest, you will find her in the Church.

Eileen first found out about the Historical Society in 1974 from a blurb in the local paper that said there would be a meeting to start the Historical Society downstairs at the former Marine Bank. Eileen attended and joined that night as a lifetime member.

LOCAL ARTISTS: DEAL OR NO DEAL?

Our area is chuck full of buildings that speak to the origin of Germantown and the first settlers here. Dheinsville Settlement is a perfect example. Philip Dhein and his family arrived in 1842 and purchased land for his family and that of friends who would soon come from the Hunsrück region of Germany and buy directly from him, rather than from the Government. A much simpler process, even then. These families paid \$1.25 per acre!!!

The Settlement is home to the Valentine Wolf Haus, where 12 children were raised and a shoemakers shop was operated out of the home. The Christ Church of Local History was once known as the Evangelical Christ Church and founded by Phillip Dhein Sr. and his wife. The Wolf/Shuster barn is home to the Bast Bell Museum and the original Germantown Mutual Insurance Company office is still standing just a block away, being used as a private residence. There are still buildings on Old Main Street Germantown that sing of our history, as well.

We are announcing an Art Challenge. Draw some of the Historic Buildings of Germantown, particularly Dheinsville Settlement.
