Christ Church Museum Renovation

The Germantown Historical Society is in the initial stages of a major renovation project at the Christ Church Museum of Local History. Due to strong winds and storms in 2010 the church's roof was severely damaged making this the first part of the restoration project. Murphy's Roofing of Germantown will begin working on the roof as soon as the snow clears. The new roof will include fifty year shingles. Insurance will pay for part of the repair costs and the remainder will be paid for by a generous bequest from the Estate of Dorothy Naab, who was a dedicated member of the historical society and volunteer for many years.

Mary Brownell is the chair of the committee for the Church Restoration project and has already spent countless hours at the church cleaning and organizing in preparation for an upgrade to the displays in the church. After the completion of the roof, the next step will be to have the interior of the church painted which hasn't been done since 1976. The ceiling of the church hasn't been painted since approximately 1915-1920. Please stay tuned for more exciting developments in the restoration of the Church.


Board Member – Gordon Bast
