ay 1 thru 14 will combine both preservation and Tourism weeks with a flurry of activity at the "Dheinsville Settlement" in Germantown:

Beginning with the first **Saturday, May 1, 2010** the traditional Sabbath Bell – Ringing in the Christ Church will continue for a favorite beginning of the day of rest for farmers in the fields surrounding the historic church. Elmore Kraemer donated a CD to the newly organized society in 1975, which is used to hire a Bell-ringer each year to continue the tradition. A wine and cheese hour from 4 to 5 pm preceeds the ringing.

The following **Wednesday, May 5, 2010** the Bast Bell Museum will open their "Koffee Haus" to all visitors from 1 to 4 pm – including a 2 pm presentation of a special bell from the 5000+ colluctation. Special bakery and gourmet coffee are included in your admission to the museum. Adults \$6, Seniors \$5, Children 5-12 \$2.

On Thursday and Friday, May 6 and 7, 2010, a one-hour re-enactment walking tour of ten of the pre-civil war buildings in Dheinsville will feature the year 1862. When the Limestone Church was built. Students will "follow the footsteps of the early settlers who tell their stories at the old buildings which still stand in the hamlet. Hours are 9 am to 12 or 1 to 3 pm. 




EXHIBIT RENOVATION PROGRESS REPORT

We are looking for suggestions and assistance of ongoing plans for restoration of the church.


- The historic items and photos currently in the church will be labeled with the proper historic information before rearranging.
