

MEET TERRY MARGHERITA

Terry Margherita is currently the Executive Assistant at the Germantown Historical Society. Stop in and visit with her at the Bell Museum Wed-Sun. 1-4 pm.

Terry Margherita, MA, CYT is an educator and translator. In 1971 she earned her BA in Philosophy Magna cum laude at Fordham University in New York, graduating Phi Beta Kappa. Study in Germany for a year before attending graduate school enriched her life and paved the way for her MA in German, awarded in 1975 by the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Arts and Sciences. While attending Fordham, Terry taught herself yoga for greater physical and spiritual well-being, and continued her studies with classes held in Milwaukee in the late 1970s by the Himalayan Institute. She later became an initiate of the Institute and was certified in 2006 as a yoga instructor through Aura Yoga of Massachusetts.

Terry has been a library professional, an archival assistant and curator of the Tolkien Manuscripts at Marquette's Memorial Library, a legal assistant, a teacher of German and Spanish, and a translator. She studied voice for several years and has sung with the MSO Chorus, with the Bach Chamber Choir, and with the Sullivan Ensemble. She performed for four years in the medieval Play of Daniel and Plays of St. Nicholas at the Cathedral of St. John in Milwaukee, and served a term as secretary for Early Music Now.

Because of her love for nature, Terry is a long-time organic gardener, and enjoys celebrating the seasons in her garden. She studied plant culture at MATC-North and enjoys designing gardens to help others create and care for a landscape that nourishes both body and soul.

EXCERPT OF LETTER FROM HIERONYMUS BAST TO RELATIVES IN AMERICA

27 APRIL 1850

TRANSLATED BY TERRY MARGHERITA

Just think, my dearest, what my state of mind was, with only the children about me and endless work, and I also had two men quartered with me as soldiers, namely Magdeburg-Garde-Militia. For this was the time when, all across Germany, the clouds drew down, dark and thick throughout all the states. It was right during the days when our province was overrun and fell to those Freischaren who held the Oberland, mainly in Baden and Rhein-Baiern. The Freischaren-Army supposedly consists of some 300,000 men, but they could only muster 150,000. Suddenly, and to our great good fortune, our troops brought 80,000 men into these lands under the command of General von Hirschfeld and the Prince of Prussia, who held command, and they achieved a wonderful victory for our fatherland. But it cost us in blood, very little on the part of the Prussians, yet a great deal of the Freischaren. The investigation is still under way, executions are still going on. The Pomeranians are still assembled in Berlin, though they have worked out new laws for our city, which are to be mplemented by July, still in my opinion a great deal remains as it was. Since the 20th of March the elected German Reichskammer has met in Erfurt, but what their work has been is still unknown. That's how things stand now in the fatherland, no one can say a lot about the war, but no one thinks in terms of peace, because so many preparations for war are still being made, and trade and all business has quite died down.

REMEMBERING THE INSURANCE COMPANY OFFICE RESTORATION

A note from Marge and Ed Graf's daughter who lived in the house for 28 years (1962 to 1990):

Mom and Dad put their heart and soul into making it a showplace. Mom immediately went to work restoring the kitchen walls and ceiling where much plaster had fallen off. She also tackled another large chore—removing the linoleum that covered the lovely wood floors of the living room and bedrooms—and then refinished the same.

Then came painting and wall-papering. Dad re-wired the entire house, re-puttied every window and storm window. Through the years, Dad found antique shutters which were put up on all the windows. Looking good!! He enclosed the kitchen sink with bricks and old wood, paneled the bathroom and replaced the old tin shower with an old "ball-and-claw-foot" tub...and more and lots more... We loved the old place...
